4. WASTE MINIMISATION

If you find you are usually creating too much rubbish, the Council strongly suggests that you try some, or all of the following waste minimisation tips.

Avoid buying **over-packaged goods**. eg. buy fruit and vegetables loose instead of on plastic trays.

Try home composting your kitchen and garden waste. Containers are available at your local supplier or try visiting www.recyclenow.com/compost or call 0845 077 0757.

Cancel **unwanted junk mail** either by calling 0845 703 4599 (local rate call) or via the internet at www.msponline.org.uk.

Avoid all those **plastic carrier bags** at the supermarket. Buy a strong, longer lasting re-usable bag.

Make use of **Charity Shops** to pass on good quality clothes, shoes, toys, crockery, etc.

A **waste minimisation guide** is enclosed to help you further.

ONE OF THE BEST WAYS TO REDUCE YOUR VOLUME OF WASTE IS TO SQUASH BULKY THINGS, SUCH AS PLASTIC CONTAINERS AND BIG BOXES. YOU WILL GET FAR MORE IN YOUR BIN IF THESE ITEMS ARE FLATTENED FIRST.
