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Introduction

Ryedale is a predominantly rural area covering some 575 square miles (148,900 hectares) in North Yorkshire. Geographically, the largest district in North Yorkshire, Ryedale comprises a rich agricultural area, as well as including part of the North York Moors National Park. The district population 50,872 (2001 Census) is centred mainly in the twin towns of Malton and Norton, where the administration centre has been established, and the market towns of Pickering, Kirkbymoorside and Helmsley.

The resident population of Ryedale, as measured in the 2001 Census, was 50,872, of which 49 per cent were male and 51 per cent were female.

General Description

Malton Ward

This ward covers the town of Malton, the village of Old Malton and some surrounding farms. The town sits in the gap between the Howardian Hills and the Yorkshire Wolds. The River Derwent flows through the town following a circuitous route from its source in the moors above Scarborough as a result of disruption to its short route to the sea following the last ice age. Major employers are ProPak, Safeway, R Yates & Sons, and Ryedale District Council.

This ward has the highest percentage of properties in the lowest council tax band (A) in Ryedale.

New Malton was built after Archbishop Thurstan had burnt down the old town around 1138. It is understood he did this to drive out the Scots. The town was originally walled. The church of St Michael in the middle of the market place is mostly Norman. The Cross Keys public house on Wheelgate has a medieval undercroft, possibly part of the Hospital of St Mary Magdalen. York House is early 18th Century.

There are few remaining traces of the Roman Fort of Derventio, the walls being much reduced in the 18th century as part of a public works programme for the unemployed. Part of the site became a Norman castle but again little or nothing remains. A Jacobean mansion on the same site was also later demolished with only the Lodge remaining.

The Gilbertine priory of St Mary at Old Malton was founded around 1150. Only the west part of the nave and two-thirds of the façade remains of this once large church. (Pevsner, 1966)

The name of Malton is Old English (OE) and is traceable in the Domesday Book (DB):

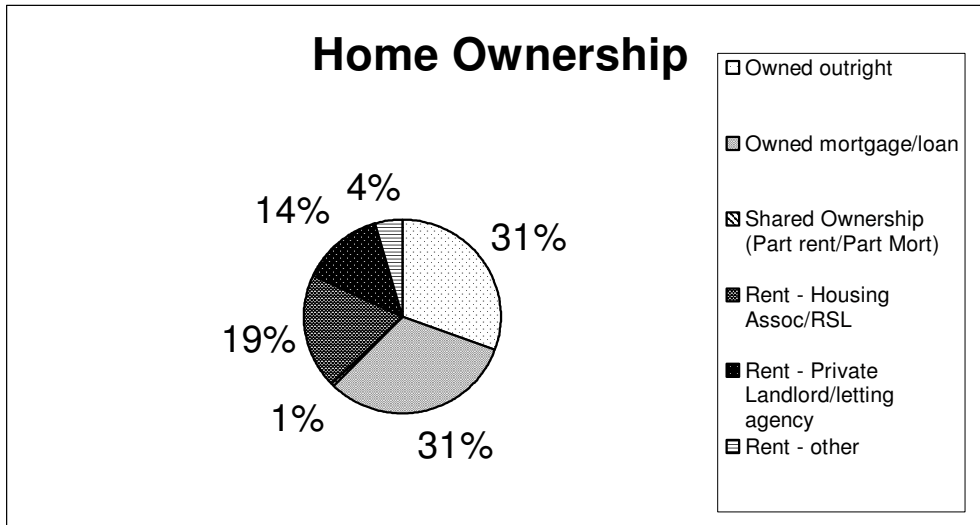

Indices of Deprivation

The Indices of Deprivation 2004 were published by the Department for Communities & Local Government (DCLG) in May 2004, and revised in June 2004. They measure deprivation at a small area level of Lower Layer Super Output Areas (SOAs). SOAs are a new geography designed for the collection and publication of small area statistics and fit within current Ryedale ward boundaries. The ID 2004 updates the ID 2000 in two key ways, more up-to-date data has been used and new measures have been incorporated as new and improved data sources have become available, therefore ID 2000 and ID 2004 are not comparable.

Index of Multiple Deprivation

The IMD 2004 provides an overall score of deprivation, combining 7 distinct categories of deprivation, known as domains. These domains cover:

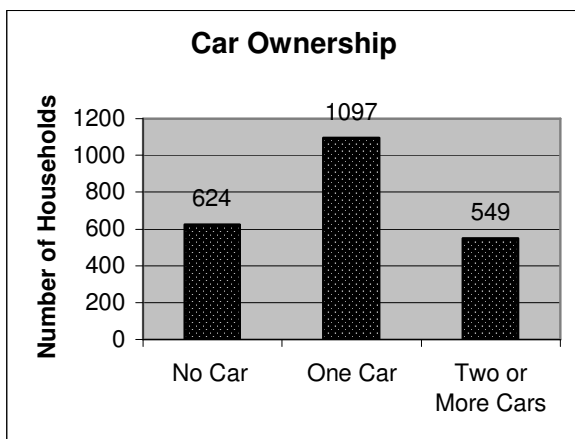
